Lytton Rancheria Tribe Announces Temporary Closure of San Pablo Lytton Casino, Effective at Midnight Tonight through April 15

SAN PABLO, CA – In response to the current health crisis surrounding the coronavirus (COVID-19), the Lytton Rancheria Tribe today announced the temporary closure of the San Pablo Lytton Casino effective at midnight tonight and continuing through Wednesday, April 15, at which time the Lytton Rancheria Tribe will reevaluate the situation. All employees will be paid during this time and medical benefits will remain.

“We place the health and safety of our guests and employees above all else and, after great consideration, have decided to close our operations at midnight tonight,” said Margie Mejia, Tribal Chairwoman of the Lytton Rancheria Tribe. “On behalf of the Lytton Rancheria Tribe, we would like to send our heartfelt condolences to those directly affected by the coronavirus.”

The Lytton Rancheria Tribe and San Pablo Lytton Casino will continue to monitor all COVID-19 developments and follow protocols recommended by local, national and international health agencies, including the Center for Disease Control.
