Dear Ms. Marquez:

City of San Pablo retained Rincon Consultants, Inc. (Rincon) to conduct a cultural resources study in support of an Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS-MND) for the 2600 Moraga Road Self Storage Project in the city of San Pablo, Contra Costa County, California. The proposed project would divide an existing 9-acre abandoned school and sports field into two parcels, north and south. The north parcel, approximately 4.1 acres, will be developed as a self-storage facility, and the southern parcel, approximately 4.9 acres, will be redeveloped as a soccer field and playground. Figure 1 depicts the regional location of the project site and Figure 2 depicts the boundaries of the project site. This memorandum presents the findings of a cultural resources study which was prepared to determine if the proposed project has the potential to impact cultural resources. Efforts included a cultural resources records search, a search of the Sacred Lands File (SLF) by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC), historical aerial imagery review, and the preparation of this technical memorandum. The project is subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the City of San Pablo is the lead agency. All work was completed in compliance with CEQA and applicable local guidelines and requirements.

Methods

Cultural Resources Records Search

Rincon requested a search of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) at the Northwest Information Center (NWIC) at Sonoma State University. The search was performed by NWIC staff on January 4, 2021. The search was conducted to identify all previously recorded cultural resources, as well as previously conducted cultural resources studies within the project site and a half-mile radius surrounding it. The CHRIS search included a review of the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), the California Register of Historical Resources (CRHR), the Office of Historic Preservation Historic Properties Directory, the California Built Environment Resources Directory, and the Archaeological Determinations of Eligibility list. The results of the CHRIS cultural resources records search are included in Attachment B.

The NWIC records search identified 34 previously conducted cultural resources studies that have been performed within a half-mile radius of the project site (Table 1). Of the 34 previously conducted cultural



resources studies, two were located within portions of the project site (S-049682 and S-049682a), further detailed below.

Study S-049682/049682a, conducted in 2017, consists of an evaluation of Colonel Hunter Hall United States Army Reserve (USAR) training facility and the immediate surrounding area, which includes portions of the project site. The report recommended the facility buildings as ineligible for inclusion in the NRHP and suggested they do not appear to be historic properties for the purposes of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act or historical resources for purposes of CEQA. In an attached letter dated July 16, 2007, the State Historic Preservation Officer concurred with a previous finding that Colonel Hunter Hall USAR facility, among other army facilities, was ineligible for listing on the NRHP. Furthermore, this study did not identify any archaeological resources within or adjacent to the project site.

The NWIC records search identified three previously recorded cultural resources within a half mile radius of the project site (Table 2), none of which are located within the project site. One is located adjacent to the west, P-07-02753, which consists of the previously discussed ineligible, Colonel Hunter Hall USAR facility.

Sacred Lands File Search

As part of the process of identifying cultural resources within or near the project site, Rincon contacted the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) on December 15, 2020 to request a review of the Sacred Lands File (SLF). The NAHC emailed a response on December 29, 2020, stating that the results of the SLF search were positive for the presence of Native American cultural resources and provided a list of eight Tribal contacts. Rincon understands the City of San Pablo is conducting Assembly Bill 52 and Senate Bill 18 consultation with local Native American groups; we have therefore not conducted any follow up with the contacts provided by the NAHC to discuss the positive result. The results of AB 52 and SB 18 will be presented in the IS-MND being prepared for the project.

Aerial Imagery Review

Rincon completed a review of historical topographic maps and aerial imagery to ascertain the development history of the project site. Aerial imagery available from 1946 to 1948 show a series of five structures along Moraga Road within the project site (NETR Online 2021). By 1958, with redevelopment of the general area, the buildings are no longer present in aerials (NETR Online 2021). Between 1980 and 2002, aerials reflect full development of the surrounding area and no further development of the project site (NETR Online 2021). The project is currently occupied by a park.

Findings and Recommendations

The CHRIS search indicated that there are no archaeological cultural resources or significant built environment cultural resources within the project site. The adjacent Colonel Hunter Hall USAR Facility (P-07- 027753), was determined ineligible for the purposes of NEPA on July 16, 2007. Historical aerial photography indicate that the project site has been previously disturbed by the construction and demolition of several buildings. The SLF search, however, returned positive results, which indicates that the area is generally sensitive for archaeological resources. Additionally, ground disturbing activities always have the potential to uncover unanticipated archaeological resources.

Based on these findings, Rincon recommends a finding of ***no impact to historical resources*** and ***less than significant impact with mitigation for archaeological resources*** under CEQA. Rincon recommends the following measures for addressing unanticipated archaeological resources, detailed below. The project is also required to adhere to state guidelines regarding human remains, also detailed below.

Unanticipated Discovery of Archaeological Resources

If archaeological resources are encountered during ground-disturbing activities, work in the immediate area should be halted and an archaeologist meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards for archaeology (National Park Service 1983) should be contacted immediately to evaluate the find. If necessary, the evaluation may require preparation of a treatment plan and archaeological testing for CRHR eligibility. If the discovery proves to be eligible for the CRHR and cannot be avoided by the project, additional work, such as data recovery excavation, may be warranted to mitigate any significant impacts to historical resources. Treatment of the resource(s) shall be determined on a case-by-case basis based on the nature of the find and in consultation between the tribes, qualified archaeologist, and lead agency.



Unanticipated Discovery of Human Remains

The discovery of human remains is always a possibility during ground-disturbing activities. If human remains are found, the State of California Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that no further disturbance shall occur until the County Coroner has made a determination of origin and disposition pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. In the event of an unanticipated discovery of human remains, the County Coroner must be notified immediately. If the human remains are determined to be prehistoric, the Coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission, which will determine and notify a most likely descendant (MLD). The MLD shall complete the inspection of the site and provide recommendations for treatment to the landowner within 48 hours of being granted access.






Dear Ms. Montgomery:

Attached is a consultation list of tribes with traditional lands or cultural places located within the boundaries of the above referenced counties or projects.

Government Codes §65352.3 and §65352.4 require local governments to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to cultural places when creating or amending General Plans, Specific Plans and Community Plans.

Public Resources Codes §21080.3.1 and §21080.3.2 requires public agencies to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources as defined, for California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) projects.

The law does not preclude local governments and agencies from initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated within your jurisdiction. The NAHC believes that this is the best practice to ensure that tribes are consulted commensurate with the intent of the law.

Best practice for the AB52 process and in accordance with Public Resources Code §21080.3.1(d), is to do the following:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, the lead agency shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section.

The NAHC also recommends, but does not require that lead agencies include in their notification letters, information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on the area of potential affect (APE), such as:

1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:
 - A listing of any and all known cultural resources have already been recorded on or adjacent to the APE, such as known archaeological sites;
 - Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by the Information Center as part of the records search response;
 - Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate or high probability that unrecorded cultural resources are located in the APE; and
 - If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.

2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:

- Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.

All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for public disclosure in accordance with Government Code Section 6254.10.

3. The result of the Sacred Lands File (SFL) check conducted through the Native American Heritage Commission was positive. Please contact the tribes on the attached list for more information.
4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the potential APE; and
5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the potential APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS is not exhaustive, and a negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a tribal cultural resource. A tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the event, that they do, having the information beforehand well help to facilitate the consultation process.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify the NAHC. With your assistance we can assure that our consultation list remains current.
